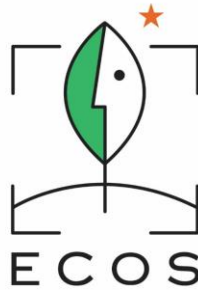

REPRESENTING ENVIRONMENTAL INTERESTS IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF EUROPEAN STANDARDS IN THE FIELD OF CHAIN OF CUSTODY AND TRACEABILITY

ECOS is looking for experts in the field of chain of custody and traceability to represent environmental interests in the development of standards and to assist in supply chain research. Experts will provide technical and scientific input into discussions, in accordance with the related policy context and ECOS strategy. Relevant types of expertise include:

- **Chain of custody concepts and supply chain models (e.g. identity preserved, segregation, mass balance, book and claim), AND**
- **Traceability mechanisms ensuring good practice and respect the environment all the way along the supply chain**

ECOS is the only pan-European NGO promoting environmental interests in the development of standards. With over 15 years' experience in standards and technical policies, ECOS represents 46 European and national members, including WWF, EEB, T&E, and Friends of the Earth Europe. The nominated expert(s) will:

1. represent ECOS in one or several (depending on expertise) technical committees (TCs):
 - ISO/PC 308 'Chain of Custody';
 - ISO/PC 287 'Chain of Custody for Wood and Wood-based Products' and any TC directly deriving from this project committee;
2. Assist ECOS' Staff with the development of chain of custody frameworks applying to various sectors, with a focus on bio-based products and on the plastic value chain

The nominated experts will be responsible for:

- Participating and promoting ECOS' position in relevant TCs and working group meetings
- Preparing technical input e.g. official comments and position papers
- Reporting to ECOS Policy Officer and completing agreed upon follow-up actions within the defined deadline
- Exchanging information with ECOS member organisations and other experts within ECOS taskforces.

Interested candidates should be able to illustrate an in-depth knowledge in the topic area indicated above. Experience with, and understanding of, the policy context of the topic area will be considered a strong asset. Candidates should also demonstrate a strong commitment to environmental NGO values. Fluency in English is a must.

ECOS will offer:

- A competitive daily remuneration for preparation of meetings, participation and reporting, as well as for any other tasks performed between meetings
- Reimbursement of travel costs
- Per diem to cover accommodation and subsistence costs.
