In this role, you will lead our campaign and advocacy work to make all public procurement in the EU truly green by 2030, starting with the most intensive materials such as steel or cement.

About ECOS: ECOS is an international NGO with a network of members and experts advocating for environmentally friendly standards, policies and laws. We ensure the environmental voice is heard when they are developed and drive change by providing expertise to policymakers and industry players, leading to the implementation of strong environmental principles. Our successes include securing a ban on new fossil fuel boilers, mainstreaming ecodesign, introducing universal chargers, and improving our right to repair. Skills and experience required:

- Minimum 5 years of relevant professional experience, preferably with NGOs, institutions, consultancies, or companies working in the environmental field
- Knowledge of industrial and/or green public procurement policies at national, European or international level or a desire and capacity to develop such knowledge
- Demonstrated experience in developing & implementing strategies to achieve change, ideally by leading coalitions or campaigns
- Willingness to developing understanding of technical work and the standardisation processes
- Commitment to the values, vision and mission of environmental NGOs
- Strong analytical skills & ability to translate technical information into digestible information
- Excellent time and project management skills
- Excellent writing, communication, networking and negotiation skills
- Fluent English, other languages an asset
