




RES-001: Container design



Certification for: Container manufacturers

- Minimum durability of 45 uses, with increases based on return rate
- Restricted materials and chemicals aligned with PlastChem Report
- Geometry and texture that enhances washability
- Component requirements (reconditioning)
- Recyclability (according to APR & RecyClass guidelines)

RES-002: Washing, inspecting & packing for distribution



Certification for: Washing facilities

Published: July 2025

- Facility layout
- Employee protections
- Washing, sanitizing, & drying
- Inspection
- Packing for distribution
- Standardized record keeping



Certification for: Reuse system operations

- Recommends digital language for reusable containers and collection points
- Uses GS1 to incorporate reuse data with POS
- Standardizes data elements
- Enables diverse incentive programs




RES-005: System Operations & Performance



Certification for: Reuse system operators

- Requirements to calculate:
 - return rate
 - decommissioning rate
 - use-cycles (rotations)
- Minimum # of use-cycles based on potential to reduce waste (currently)
- System record keeping, data, and metrics

RES-006: Collection Points



Certification for: Collection point manufacturers

Covers:

- Accessibility
- Safety & security
- Adaptable to new packaging formats

* GOAL: 6 standards finalized by early 2026 *
