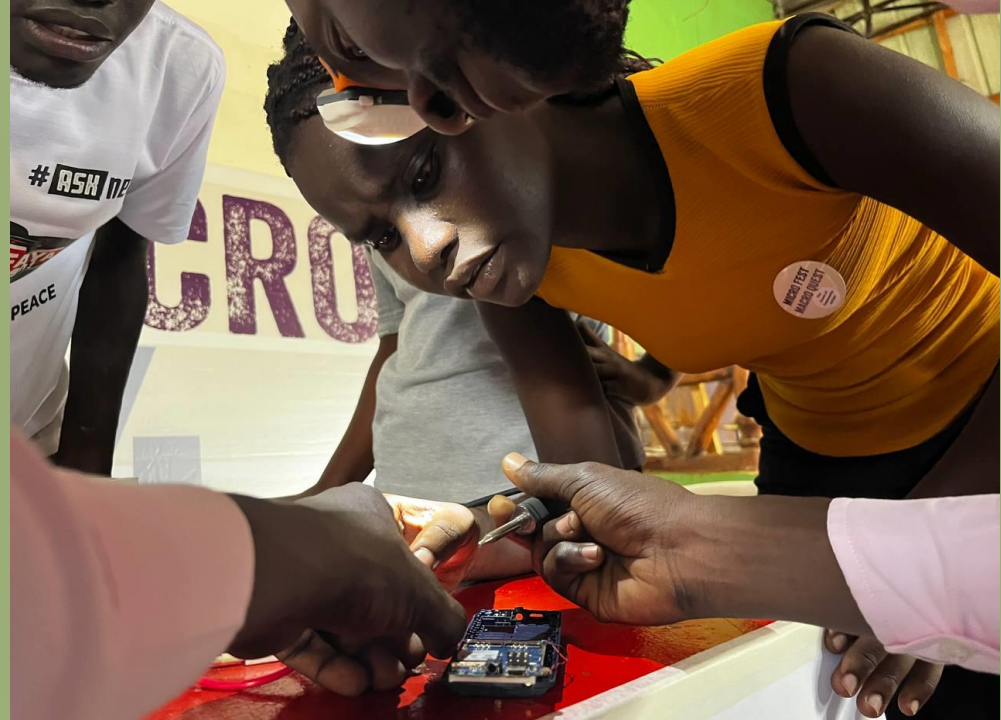
Operating MakerSpaces in Rhino Camp and Yei South Sudan, providing daily Repair and maintenance services and Training

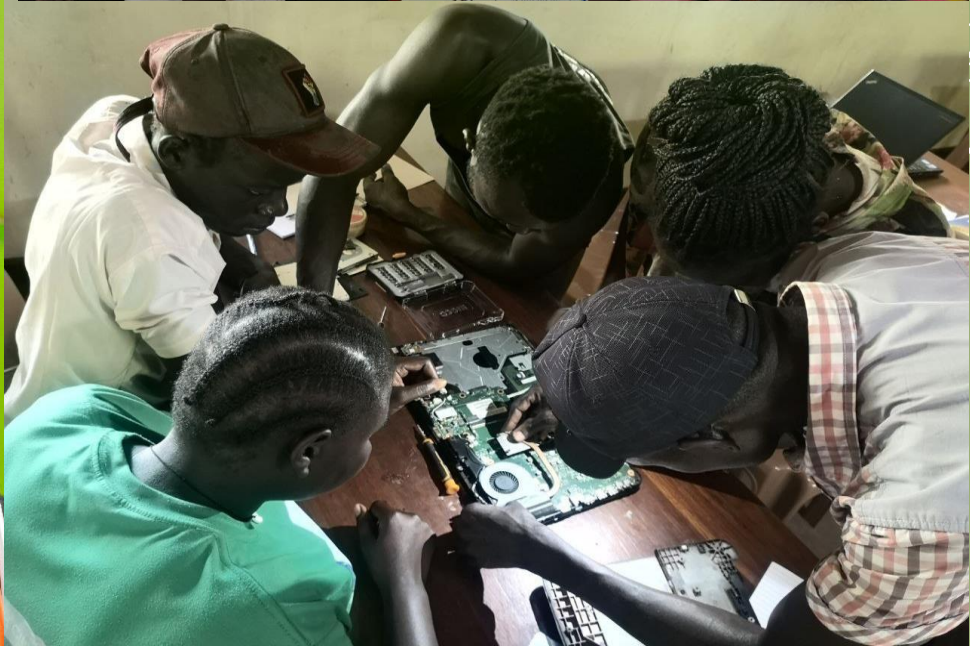
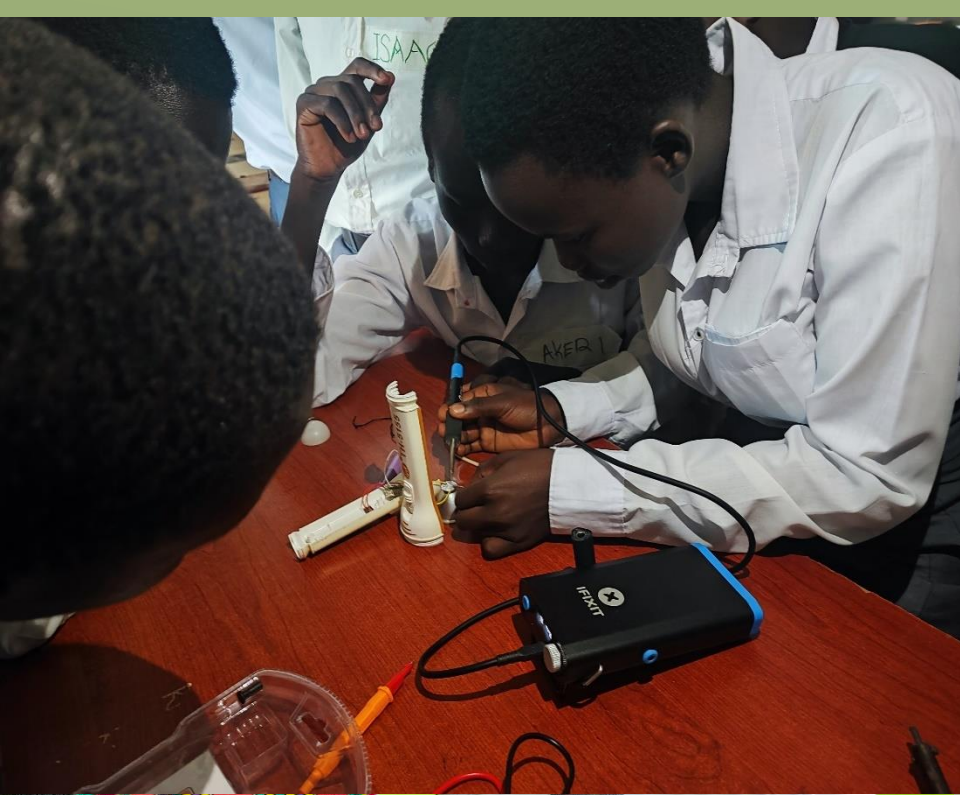

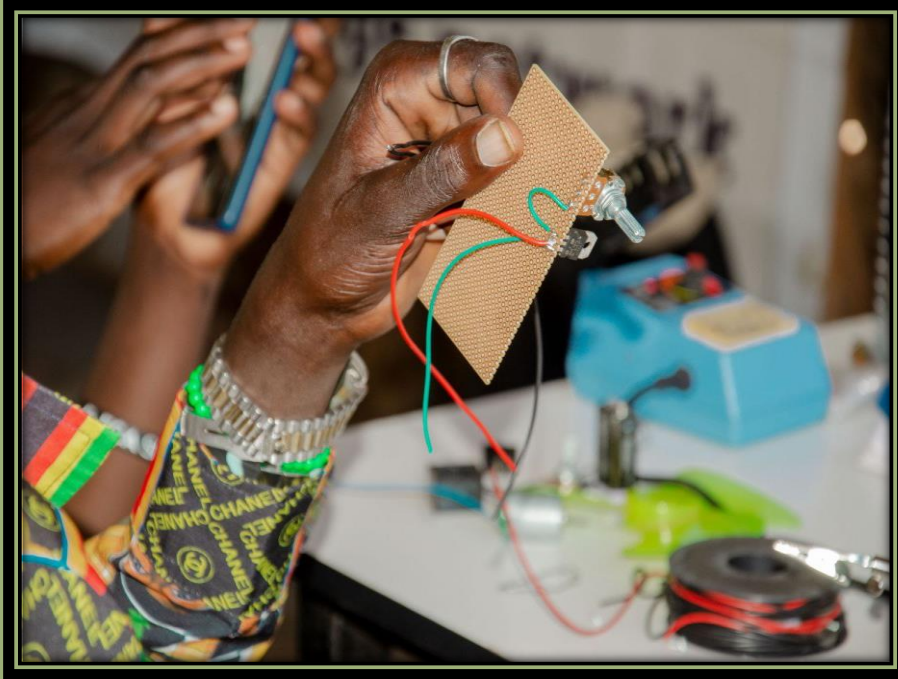

From 2022 - 2025  
Repairing over 3,500 devices



8 Hours per repair café  
Commemorated International Repair Day  
Maximum attendance 300 individuals



# ORGANIZED CAMPAIGNS AGAINST MICROSOFT WINDOWS 10 END OF LIFE

Many Refugees use old laptops with old hardware.

- We hosted repair café workshops to train the youth on installation of alternative operating systems like Linux OS such as Zorin, Ubuntu
- 30 Laptops saved from landfill

# Impact on Youth and Communities

Reached Over 5,500 individuals, 350(214 males and 136 females), trained in basic electronics repair and maintenance, e-waste upcycling, alongside computer literacy,

- Improved Employability (25 participants are now employed, 7 have started small businesses, 9 serve as ICT instructors and repair volunteers, and 9 are employed by institutions)
- Increased digital inclusion enabling access to information, communication, financial services and education
- Local innovation and problem-solving
- Reduced electronic waste through repair culture
- Empowerment of women and girls in technology
- Reduced social/societal division and enhanced social cohesion



# CHALLENGES



- Repair is undervalued – lack of legislation supporting repair and low awareness
- Lack of repair data
- Lack of Electricity.
- Lack of Tools and equipment's
- Limited access to spare parts and expensive
- Many electronics are unrepairable
- Absence of repair forums in Africa
- Lack of Funding
- Lack of transport to host repair cafes in far areas
